Mayor's Report

Mayor Mahler commended the Police Department for the awesome job they are doing. Mayor Mahler stated they are extremely professional and he witnessed a motor vehicle accident where the officer went over and above the call of duty.

City Manager's Report

City Manager Ray Towry stated he will be helping the COG with interviews for their Assistant Director this week. CM Towry also commended staff for smooth operations during his vacation.

Department Directors Reports:

Finance Director

Finance Director Neish reviewed the reports included in the packet. He reported an increase of passports. Last month there were 16 new utility billing accounts opened, 12 were owners and 4 were renters. Last month 69 accounts were turned off for non-payment, this month 75 accounts are scheduled for turn off. Councilor Gerson asked what percentage of those accounts on the shut off list are owners versus renters.

Library Director

Library Services Director Peda announced two programs. Brad Story will perform Tuesday, April 17th and Ricardo Cardenas will perform Thursday, April 19th.

Community and Economic Development Director

Community and Economic Development Director Jerry Sorte announced changes coming in State law regarding Accessory Dwellings. SB1051 will be effective July 1, 2018 and will allow accessory units.

CEDD Sorte reviewed the Sweet Home Enterprise zone with the Council and stated we are nearing the end of the 10 years cycle of the zone. Continued boundaries of the current zone should be reviewed.

Councilor Gerson stated her concern over variances granted by the Planning Commission. Councilor Gerson wanted to be sure decisions are consistent and criteria met. CEDD Sorte stated in addition to Planning Commission training, language in the code update will make variances more difficult to apply for to meet the Council's concern of variances to the code. Councilor Gourley asked if the code update could come before Council in increments as opposed to the whole update at once.

Police Chief

Chief Lynn announced April is Child Abuse Awareness Month and on Saturday an event was held called Walk a Mile for a Child. The event was larger than last year and will continue to grow.

Chief Lynn stated Officer McDonald and K9 Gemma are on the road.

Chief Lynn stated call volumes have increased.
