ORDINANCE NO. 277

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF SWEET HOME OF CONTIGUOUS NEW TERRITORY EAST OF SAID CITY AND PROVIDING FOR AN ELECTION IN SAID TERRITORY SUBMITTING THE QUESTION OF SUCH ANNEXATION TO THE REGISTERED VOTERS INSIDE OF THE TERRITORY TO BE ANNEXED, FIXING THE TIME OF SUCH ELECTION, DESIGNATING THE POLLING PLACES AND POLLING HOURS, AND APPOINTING AND DESIGNATING THE NAMES OF THE JUDGES AND CLERKS OF ELECTION, DIRECTING THE PUBLICATION AND POSTING OF NOTICE OF SAID ELECTION, AND PRESCRIBING THE CONTENTS THEREOF.

WHEREAS, on July 27, 1954 by Resolution No. 26 for 1954 the City Council elected to dispense with submitting to the registered voters of the City of Sweet Home the question whether the boundaries of said City should be altered and the contiguous new territory herein described included therein, and fixed the 24th day of August, 1954 at 8:00 o'clock p.m. at the City Hall at Sweet Home as the time and place for a public hearing before the City Council at which the registered voters of the City should appear and be heard on the question of such annexation, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said resolution notices of said public hearing was posted and published as directed thereby and due proof of such posting and publication have been filed with City Recorder, and

WHEREAS said hearing was held at the time and place described in said resolution and at said hearing no registered voter of the City appeared in opposition to such annexation,

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY OF SWEET HOME DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Contiguous new territory hereinafter described shall be annexed to the City of Sweet Home, Oregon, upon the condition that the majority of the votes cast in said territory at a special election hereinafter provided for are in favor of such annexation.

SECTION 2. The contiguous new territory referred to in this ordinance and so proposed to be annexed is described as follows:

Beginning at a point 1.03 feet South and 1,189.50 feet East of the Southwest corner of the William Ames Donation Land Claim No. 45, in Section 32, Township 13 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in Linn County, Oregon, said beginning point being at the intersection of the center line of the County Road and East line of the city limits of the City of Sweet Home; and running thence Northeasterly along the center line of said County Road 1,342.02 feet; thence North 0°17' West 1,325.59 feet; thence South 87°14' West 675.70 feet to a point where the East line of the Weddle addition to Sweet Home intersects the center line of Larch Street; thence in a Westerly direction along the center line of Larch Street to the East line of the city limits; thence Southerly along said East line of the city limits to the point of beginning.

SECTION 3. The question of such annexation shall be submitted to the registered voters inside of the territory so proposed to be annexed at a special election at the time and place hereinafter designated, at which time the proposition to be submitted to said voters and to be voted upon by them as stated on the ballot at said election and in the notices of said election shall be as follows:

"Shall the boundaries of the City of Sweet Home be altered and the contiguous new territory hereinafter described included therein, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 1.03 feet South and 1,189.50 feet East of the Southwest corner of the William Ames Donation Land Claim No. 45, in Section 32, Township 13 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian, in Linn County, Oregon, said beginning point being at the intersection of the center line of the County Road and East line of the city limits of the City of Sweet Home; and running thence Northeasterly along the center line of said County Road 1,342.02 feet; thence North 0 17' West 1,325.59 feet; thence South 87 14' West 675.70 feet to a point where the East line of the Weddle addition to Sweet Home intersects the center line of Larch Street; thence in a Westerly direction along the center line of Larch Street to the East line of the city limits; thence Southerly along said East line of the city limits to the point of beginning.

SECTION 4. Said special election shall be held on the 5th day of October, 1954. The polling place for said election shall be the Administration building of the Federal Public Housing Project east of the present east city limits, known as Timberland Manor, on 22nd Avenue, which is within the territory so proposed to be annexed, and which is the same place as the polling place used at the last general election in said territory. The polling hours shall be from 8:00 A.M. until 8:00 P.M., Pacific Standard Time. The following persons are hereby appointed and designated judges and clerks of said election respectively, to-wit:

SECTION 5. Notice of said election shall be published once each week for four successive weeks, being five publications in all, prior to said election in the New Era, which is a newspaper of general circulation in the City. Notices of said election shall be posted for a period of four successive weeks prior to said election in four public places in the said territory proposed to be annexed, as follows:

1. Telephone pole Southeast corner of intersection of 23rd Avenue and Lang Street.
2. Pacific Power & Light power pole in front of house no. 15 on 23rd Avenue.
3. Pacific Power & Light power pole at Southwest corner of intersection of 24th Avenue and Lang Street.
4. Pacific Power & Light power pole across street from house no. 26 on 24th Avenue.

SECTION 6. The notices so published and posted shall each contain the following:

A designation of the boundaries of the territory proposed to be annexed; An invitation to the registered voters of said territory to vote on such annexation; a distinct statement of the proposition to be submitted; a statement of the hours at which the polls will be open in the territory so proposed to be annexed; a statement that the polling place at such special election shall be the Administration Building of the Federal Public Housing Project east of the present east city limits, known as Timberland Manor on 22nd Avenue, which is within the territory so proposed to be annexed, and which is the same place as the polling place used at the last general election in said territory; and a statement that it is the same place as the polling place used at the last general election in said territory; a designation of the judges and clerks of said election, stating their names, and a statement that said election will be held on the 5th day of October, 1954.

SECTION 7. This ordinance shall be subject to referendum as provided by law.

Passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor this 31st day of August, 1954.
