

O R D I N A N C E BILL NO 27 for 1953

ORDINANCE NO. 259

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 4 OF ORDINANCE NO. 32 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING OFFENSES AND DISORDERLY CONDUCT, DEFINING WHAT SHALL CONSTITUTE THE SAME, AND PROVIDING FOR THE PUNISHMENT THEREOF." PASSED BY THE COUNCIL AND APPROVED BY THE MAYOR ON APRIL 16, 1929 and MAKING IT UNLAWFUL FOR ANY PERSON TO INTERFERE WITH A POLICE OFFICER OR PEACE OFFICER WHO IS ENGAGED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF HIS DUTIES OR TO ESCAPE FROM ARREST OR CUSTODY AND PROVIDING A PENALTY AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

THE CITY OF SWEET HOME DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 4 of Ordinance No. 32 entitled "An Ordinance concerning offenses and disorderly conduct, defining what shall constitute the same, and providing for the punishment thereof," passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor on April 16, 1929 is hereby amended to read as follows:


Sec. 4. That any person who shall resist or who shall interfere with any Peace Officer or Police Officer who is engaged in the performance of his duties or who shall refuse to assist any such officer in the discharge of his duties when requested to do so, or who shall escape or attempt to escape from arrest or custody of any Peace Officer or Police Officer or who shall by any means whatever aid or assist any person in custody upon a charge of violating any city ordinance in his endeavor to escape from such custody, whether such escape should be effected or not, shall upon conviction thereof in the Municipal Court be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 or imprisoned in the City Jail not

less than five days nor more than fifty days.

Section 2. Inasmuch as the foregoing amendment is necessary to the peace, safety and welfare of the citizens of Sweet Home, the Council finds and declares that an emergency exists and the Council deems it expedient that this ordinance take effect immediately and this ordinance shall be in effect immediately after it is passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor.
