

ORDINANCE BILL. No. 4, 1936.

ORDINANCE No. 37

AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 32 of the City of Sweet Home, entitled, "An Ordinance concerning offenses and disorderly conduct, defining what shall constitute the same, and providing for the punishment thereof", passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor April 16, 1929, by adding thereto Section 18-A, concerning Bonfires, and permits therefor.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF SWEET HOME DO ORDAIN AS

FOLLOWS:-

Section 1. That Ordinance No. 32 of the City of Sweet Home, entitled, "An Ordinance concerning offenses and disorderly conduct, defining what shall constitute the same, and providing for the punishment thereof", passed by the Council and approved by the Mayor, April 16, 1929, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto between Sections 18 and 19 a section to be known as Section 18-A, which Section 18-A shall read as follows:-

"Section 18-A. No person shall light or kindle a bonfire or any fire for the purpose of consuming waste material in the open air, within the limits of the City of Sweet Home, from Aug 15 to Oct 15 of each year, regardless of whether the same be lighted on a public street or other public ground, or on private property, without first having obtained a written permit so to do, signed by the Chief of Police, who shall in all cases when requested so to do grant permits therefor, excepting where in his judgment the kindling of such fire would endanger the safety of life or property. Any person or persons violating this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$25, or imprisonment in the City Jail not less than 2 days or more than 12 days upon conviction of such violation in the Recorder's Court."
